Please review the following memo regarding our school's dress code policy. This policy was also discussed in assembly on Wednesday, April 17, 2013.

Dress Code

While student dress and grooming is a concern that begins at home, you should use common sense and good judgment by avoiding offensive or distracting types of clothing. Some common rules that often need to be enforced are:

- No hats (except religious headgear – Yarmulke, Hijab or Patka)
- No visual display of underwear or midriff
- No clothing displaying suggestive, profane, or discriminatory statements, symbols, or pictures is
- No sheer or transparent clothing
- No exposed backs or midriffs
- No shorts, skirts or dresses that are shorter than 6 inches above the knee
- No tank tops, tube tops or halter tops
- No shirts that expose bras/underwear or anatomy from the front/back or side

Please know that in an effort to not disrupt the educational process, we will provide you with a Museum School t-shirt to wear if you come to school dressed in an inappropriate manner. If you refuse to wear the t-shirt, your parent/guardian will be called and asked to bring you a change of clothes or to pick you up from school.

All teachers have been advised to send you to the dean's office if they feel you are dressed in an inappropriate manner.
