- NYC Museum School is a great school. Room for growth around teacher voice.
   Empowered teacher teams are the engines of a school improvement, innovation and growth. Student voice is also very important. Goal to prioritize equity agenda at school.

- Rhonda Seinfeld, School Secretary is retiring this year. Congratulations and thank you.

#### Committees report

### **Diversity Committee:**

John LaLena, Gillian Sowell:

- Discussion of school admissions rubric and possibility of adding consideration of economic need. Admissions will be very changed in the fall because of lack of grades and test scores. Museum is a District 2 priority school that has traditionally drawn from outside D2.
- Mauro Antognelli: Requested additional information to help see the change in racial diversity over time.
- Beth Davies: Discussion of outreach, even within D2.
- Jamie Markovitz: if fairs are virtual, online communication would be asset. Ms. Skirianos' social media is very strong platform for outreach.
- Discussion of promotion on social media, having current parents promote to their middle schools.
- Joel Lowy: School is in conversation with enrollment about diversity and recruitment.

# Museums/institutions:

- Mauro Antognelli: partnerships that we can have to strengthen ties and reduce costs, e.g., American Museum of Natural History.
- Beth Davies: In current climate, institutions are developing online modules. Parents can help assess museum online capacity for teachers to find strongest ones for partnership.
- Coordination important so info is organized for teachers.

# Corporations:

- Financial and educational partnerships possible. What works best for teachers.
- Jamie Markovitz: NYC Museum School has been officially accepted as a Google Partner.
   Coordination with Mr. Lowy. Upcoming July workshop. Everfi finance workshop opportunity has been circulated good group active at Morgan Stanley.
- Amazon partnership in the works (Associate program). Possible role of Amazon wishlists for teacher supply needs.

#### Educational

- Mauro Antognelli: Has been directly involved with a free NYCares SAT prep program held on Saturday mornings at the Quest to Learn HS on 18<sup>th</sup> Street. NYC Museum students were given access, options for both juniors and sophomores.

- Hope for further exploration of how graduated seniors can be supported, especially in summer after graduation and in first year of college.

CEP Goal progress. Quantifying progress on old goals, Joel Lowy:

- Regents Advanced Diploma was earned by 88 of 113 students. That is higher number. May be a goal again for 20-21, some of whom repeated exams to earn a higher score.
- AP Classes: School offers 10 AP Classes and will expand the number of sections for some of them next year.
- Collaborative & Trusting Relationships. Some of events not held for all metrics. Communication and outreach. Multilingual can always be expanded.
- Attendance was high this year. Engaged students attendance above 80% at the moment even with no new work being given.
- Goal of assessing IEPs to appropriately update them during four year.

Discussion of timing of CEP goals for 2020-2021 – timing still being revised

### **New Business:**

Budget: Budget cuts are anticipated for upcoming year. 2020-2021 budget not out yet.
 Already budget cut of 3% is projected across system. Hopeful that Museum will have no staff cuts. Title I last year was 2019-2020. Income forms will be collected in the fall.
 Impact of Covid-19 may change income levels and bring Title I funding back to school in 2021-2022

# Thinking toward the fall:

- Mauro Antognelli call for additional thoughts
- Gillian Sowell, for CEP goals for 2020-2021 have opportunity to take into account new leadership situation vs. rolling over old goals.
- Joel Lowy: The positive consequences of this moment will be retained. Closeness of the community and teachers brought together -- all are committed to continuing this. Looking forward to retaining this energy of collaborative relationships for the fall.
